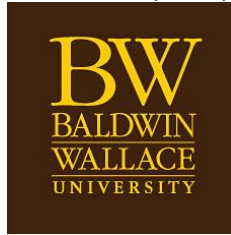

When Galaxies Collide

The Burrell Observatory is proud to host an open house program on Friday September 07, 2018 at 7:30 PM. Dr. Jillian Scudder assistant professor of physics at Oberlin College will present a lecture on galaxy collisions. Galaxies exist in clusters, and, as a result, they occasionally “collide”. In fact the Milky Way galaxy has collided with a number of smaller galaxies. The result of these collisions will be topic of Dr. Scudder’s lecture.

The lecture will be presented in the John Patrick Theater located in the Kleist Center for Art and Drama.

After the lecture, the Burrell Observatory will be open for viewing, weather permitting.
